Cookery Corner

Scotch Eggs

4 large eggs 275g sausage meat 2 tsp dried Thyme 1 spring onion, thinly chopped Salt and pepper 125g plain flour 125g breadcrumbs 1 egg, beaten Vegetable oil for deep fat frying



Method

Boil the eggs in a pan of hot water, then let simmer for 5 minutes. Drain and cool the eggs in ice water to avoid the grey ring. Mix the sausage meat with the thyme, onion and season well with salt and pepper. Divide the sausage meat into four and flatten out into circles. Season the flour with salt and pepper and spread onto a plate.

Smother the eggs in the flour and place in the sausage meat circles. Wrap it around the egg, ensuring there are no gaps. Next, roll each egg onto the beaten egg, coating completely, and then roll the eggs in breadcrumbs and

Set aside. Heat the oil in a heavy bottom saucepan until a breadcube turns brown when dropped in. Using a slotted spoon, carefully lower each egg into the oil. Deep fry until golden and crispy. Remove and grain on kitchen paper. Eat hot with chips and baked beans or allow to cool and take on picnics or packed lunches. Enjoy!

The Swan Diaries Tales from the lakeside

Fluffy season is in full swing and they are growing at an amazing rate this year! The earliest goslings, both Greylag and Canada geese, already have a lot of adult feathers and are close to full grown size in just a few weeks.

It's now about seven years since I first started feeding the water birds at Ashland Lake, initially just the swans but the geese very quickly made themselves known to me and with each year that passes, they get more and more confident with me. The Greylags are more timid by nature, so have always been a lot more reserved than the Canada geese, but last year I worked extra hard to win the trust of two Greylag families and it has really paid off as this year the Greylags have been as happy to bring me their fluffies as the always confident Canadians.

Every year the fluffies are very quick to learn that I'm friendly and they're always pleased to see me. When I arrive they rush towards me with their tiny little wings outstretched excitedly, until they've grown enough to actually fly to me and that is always a magical moment. This year though, they are even more familiar with me than usual and have been hand-feeding (even the Greylags) and climbing all over me too. Yesterday I had about fifteen assorted fluffies crowding around the mixed corn container happily devouring the food like a big game of Hungry Hippos, one even used the lid of the container as a ramp to climb up the side and get to the food!

Fred and Wilma still don't seem to be any closer to finishing their nest and laying eggs, but on the canal we have a very welcome new pair of swans with two cygnets. I've seen them several times now so it's looking hopeful they will stay close by, and I think they'll be known as Rosie and Jim because of the canal connection. By Allie Short
