As you know YourMK have hired a company called Pennington Choices to carry out a survey of MK Council houses. The timetable for this is shown here. Tinkers Bridge dates are for this month. Some information about the survey from YourMK:

The survey is a technical based assessment lasting around 40 minutes. • Access inside and outside of council homes will be needed. There will be flexible appointment times available.

A surveyor from Pennington Choices will show identification. Someone will need to be present in the property during the survey but there will be no requirement for tenants to answer any questions. Those homes that need a survey will receive a letter about a week or so beforehand, detailing when Pennington's Choices' surveyors will be coming to the area. The letter will contain several contact options for making an appointment if needed.

Come to our TB Celebration Day on the 28th and share your experiences of the survey.

COOKS CORNER

CHICKEN OR TURKEY BREAST FILLETS WITH MUSTARD AND CHEESE COATING

INGREDIENTS

1 filleted and skinned uncooked chicken or turkey breast per person

1 jar whole grain mustard

Enough grated medium cheddar cheese to cover each fillet twice

A tablespoonful of tomato ketchup for each fillet

Tomatoes to garnish

METHOD

Heat oven at 200 degrees (180 degree fan oven).

Place the chicken or turkey breasts (deboned) in a nonstick oven-proof dish.

Cover the breasts with a layer of whole grain mustard.

Sprinkle the breasts with a layer of grated cheese to cover.

Place in the centre of the hot oven for 20 minutes.

Remove from the oven and add 1 tablespoonful of tomato ketchup on top of each breast.

Scatter a layer of grated cheese on top of each breast.

Add whole cherry or sliced cooking tomatoes to the pan.

Place in the oven for a further 10 minutes to cook.

These make a quick and delicious evening meal with accompanying green vegetables and rice, pasta or potatoes.

Tip: Raw chicken or other poultry is a common cause of tummy upsets. To avoid this follow these simple measures: Throw any wrapping in the bin immediately after removal.

Always wash your hands thoroughly after handling raw chicken or turkey or the wrapping it came in. Always wash thoroughly in very hot water and washing up liquid any chopping boards, kitchen surfaces, pans, cutlery, and plates you used for the raw poultry BEFORE reusing them for any other purpose.
