BIN CUPBOARDS

Some of the bin cupboards are full of rubbish that needs removing. Doors are broken, some have no doors. THEY ARE A SAFE PLACE FOR RATS AND MICE TO BREED. DO NOT GIVE VERMIN SAFE PLACES. If you are a council tenant or a housing association tenant YourMK will repair them but you need to phone them to get it done (see left). If you live in a privately rented home, please ask your landlord about repair.

If you need help contact Ron or John, the Residents Association Environment Team have offered to help.

FLY TIPPING

Areas that are heavily littered or which suffer from fly-tipping can be a safety hazard, encourage pests and give the perception of increased crime levels in the area. Even minor instances of flytipping can encourage others to dump their rubbish there. Dumping waste illegally is a serious criminal offense (Environmental Protection Act 1990) and carries a fine of up to £50,000 and a prison sentence up to 5 years. DO NOT DEGRADE OUR ESTATE BY PUTTING OUT YOUR RUBBISH IN ANY WAY YOU PLEASE. REPORT THOSE WHO DO.

COOKS CORNER

AVOCADO AND TUNA SALAD FOR 4 PEOPLE INGREDIENTS



1 cucumber

1 large or two small ripe avocados

I large or 2 small red onions

About 2 tablespoonful of washed and chopped coriander leaves

1 can of tuna

Salt

Olive oil

Juice of half a lemon or 1 table spoonful of Lemon juice METHOD

Wash the cucumber, cut in half lengthways and cut into equal bite size pieces

Remove the skin and the stone from the avocado. (see tip) Cut the avocado into bite size pieces

Chop the washed coriander leaves

Peel and slice the onion - again into bite size pieces Open a can of tuna and break up the pieces

Gently turn all the salad ingredients into a glass bowl Add the tuna

Add a pinch of salt

Add half to a tablespoonful of olive oil according to taste Add the juice of half a lemon or about a tablespoonful of lemon juice

Gently mix the ingredients together

Serve as soon as possible after making. Serve with baguette or wraps

Tip.

You can tell if an avocado is ripe by gently pressing at both ends - it should give to your fingers but not be squashy Cut the avocado in half lengthways; it should then be easy to remove the stone with the edge of a dessert spoon and to remove the skin.



Food suitable for swans, geese and ducks would be peas, sweetcorn, lettuce, tomatoes.

NATURE NOTES

Allie Short has been taking interest in, and formed a rather unusual friendship – with two swans! The pair, who Allie has named Sage and Missy, have nested on the bank of a local lake and allows Allie, our local wildlife expert, to get close enough to give them bedding for the nest and food. Take care, you shouldn't approach swans though, they are big birds and can be quite dangerous if they feel threatened.

THE SWAN DIARIES,

Tales from the lakeside



Worrying times at the lakeside this in March as the seemingly annual flood arrived and threatened the safety of the nest, and the seven swan eggs in it.

Almost 24 hours of non-stop heavy rain caused a sudden and very severe increase in the water level

which almost reached the top of the nest. Thankfully we were able to provide enough dry bedding to help Missy swan build up the nest and raise her eggs to a safe level until the water level returned to normal. After an anxious wait, the first cygnet arrived at 1730 on May 25th - 33 days after the final egg was laid. Welcome little one
